


Each CDBG program has own application process

Each local CDBG program and CDBG state program designed to meet local needs:

Each will:

- 1. Assess needs and determine priorities
- 2. Submit a 5-yr Plan and annual Action Plans to HUD
- 3. Select projects for their CDBG funding





CDBG Eligible Activities

Planning, acquisition, design and construction

- 1. Public infrastructure
- 2. Public or nonprofit facilities
- 3. Housing rehabilitation including side services
- 4. In support of some affordable housing and job creation projects

Public services

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CDBG Ineligible Activities

- Government administrative buildings
- Operations and maintenance
- New housing construction



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CDBG Purpose = Benefit LMI Persons

LMI = low- and moderate-income

- up to 80% of area median income
- Ex. \$47,500 four person family in Grant Co.

How to document LMI benefit depends on type of project!

- 1. Area benefit
- 2. Direct benefit

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1. Project Will Benefit Everyone in an Area

Define the benefit area

- City/town or district boundaries
- System or facility service area

At least 51% of area population must be LMI

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2. Project Directed to LMI persons

Direct assistance programs (all persons LMI)


Ex. local housing rehabilitation program, regional microenterprise assistance program

- Person applies for assistance and income qualifies
- Documentation = tax records, pay stubs, etc.

Limited Clientele projects (over half persons LMI)

Facility/service's purpose to benefit LMI persons

- 1. Has user income data, or
- 2. HUD Presume LMI Group Ex. elderly persons = senior center, homeless shelter



2 Other CDBG Objectives

Used under limited circumstances:

- Prevent or eliminate slum/blight
- Address immediate threat to public health & safety

Doesn't require benefit to LMI

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Federal Grant Requirements

- Environmental Review (SEPA/NEPA)
- Procurement requirements
- Davis-Bacon Prevailing Wage
- Civil Rights compliance
- Acquisition & Relocation (seller/tenant rights)
- Audit
- Subrecipient monitoring



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CDBG - Recommended Next Steps

- 1. Determine project fit with CDBG
- Eligible activity, benefit to LMI, high need
- 2. Develop project budget
- 3. Est grant need using Rate Affordability Review
- 4. Research and apply to funding (loan) partners
- 5. Visit website for CDBG news and documents
- 6. Attend CDBG workshop in March



Federal Budget Decreases and Delays

2018 \$12 million to state CDBG

- > 9% more than 2017
- > 25% less than 2010

2019 \$?

➤ Range from \$0 to \$12 million

April - hope Congress approves allocation

August – hope 2019 funds available
