WHEREAS, the WPWTP Expansion Project is a multi-phase project that will increase treatment capacity and improve resiliency and redundancy of the potable water system for Pasco; and

WHEREAS, Phase II is currently at 60% design and will provide the plant the ability to divert 12MG of raw water and subsequently pump the treated 12MG into the existing water distribution system; and

WHEREAS, to help fund these improvements, the City applied for and received a \$9,753,258.92 low interest State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan from the WSDOH; and

WHEREAS, the loan agreement has a term of 20-years, interest rate of 1,75%, and 1% fee; and

WHEREAS, to make the Washington State Department of Health loan funds available, execution of the attached Loan Agreement is required.
