



The Public Works Board (PWB)





The Washington Legislature created the **Washington State Public Works Board (PWB)** in 1985. The Governor appoints 13 members to the PWB, who represent cities, counties, special purpose districts, and the general public. **The PWB offers low-interest financing for essential infrastructure systems.**


Updated Hardship Methodology & Use of Grants

- Considers Median Household Income (MHI) 25% below the state MHI as distressed.
- Considers County Unemployment Rates above 20% of three year average as distressed.
- Allows MHI data from census level tracts to be considered.
- Distressed projects eligible for reduced interest rates & 25% grant.
- Severely distressed projects eligible for reduced interest rates & 50% grant.



- Once granted a construction award, it can be submitted as a reimbursable cost to the PWB






Why is EB a topic now?

- Pandemic has created a need to utilize electronic bidding
 - Smaller staffs
 - Remote Environment
 - Need for additional bidders
- MRSC and Department of Commerce able to reduce cost barriers
- New legislative changes make contract administration tools more important
 - MRSC helping to implement SB 5268

What is Electronic Bidding?

- Digital platform to post solicitations
- Ability to receive and organize responses
- Ability to calculate low bid
- Reporting functionality
- Award management



SB 5268 directives – Solicitation Process

Requirement to solicit all businesses on Roster category

SB 5268 - Information gathering/notification

Record and make bid quotes publicly available

Publish contractors awarded and contacted for direct contracting

Eligibility documents filed with appropriate agency





 - Capture the entire bidding process online so you can easily pull audit trail reports of all purchasing decisions
