

Net-Zero Vision



- Improve the state's energy resilience and security



- Equitable distribution of benefits, improved health conditions




How are solar programs funded in Washington?

 - WSU Energy Program


- Federally funded passthrough
 - Formula grants
 - Competitive grants
 - Investment tax credits

Growth of solar grant funding at Commerce




Program Development Process

Solar Energy Retrofits for Public Buildings



- Purchase and installation of solar energy systems in public facilities
- Local government, public higher education, school districts, state agencies and tribal governments
- Priority consideration: projects in small cities or towns and projects that use made-in-Washington solar modules or inverters

Solar Plus Storage for Resilient Communities

\$74 million



- Solar and battery storage in community buildings
- Enhance grid resiliency and provide backup power for critical needs during outages
- Provide incentives for electric utility demand response programs that include customer-sited solar and battery systems
- Planning and predevelopment work

Community Solar and Storage for Low Income

\$39 million

- Community solar and battery storage projects for public assistance organizations serving low-income communities
- 12 kW to 1 MW DC
- 2+ subscribers or 1 lowincome service provider
- Planning and predevelopment work

Large Scale Solar Innovation

\$19 million



Advance large-scale solar innovation in Washington

Dual Use Solar Pilot

\$10.6 million



- Support the planning, predevelopment, and installation of commercial, dual-use solar power demonstration projects
- Eligible grant recipients include nonprofit organizations, public entities, and federally recognized tribes

Solar for All Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund

- Focus: expand access to solar for income-qualified residents, with focus on frontline communities
- \$250 million request to serve over 10,000 households across Washington through 4 programs:
 - Washington Affordable Solar Homes (WASH)
 - Expanded Shared Solar Access Program (ESSAP)
 - Bridging Energy Affordability through Multifamily Solar (BEAMS)
 - Tribal Solar Program
- Federal government will issue notice of awards next summer— could be lower than requested amount
- If awarded, Commerce will use the first year for program design, including community engagement. Programs would open in 2025.

And more...

- Tribal Clean Energy
 - \$10 million exclusively for tribes to support clean energy development projects
- Clean Energy Siting and Permitting
 - \$10 million for local governments and tribes to support site predevelopment, land use studies, and planning

- Grid resilience and reliability
 - \$70 million federal and state funding for modernizing electric grid
 - Electrical grid integration and innovation


